RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On or about September 3, 2021, the Secretary filed a *Motion to Dismiss* this case on the grounds that "[t]he Secretary has determined that the debt is eligible for repurchase as the Title I lender received payment in full prior to claim payment." *Id.* at ¶ 3. The Secretary further states that "HUD is dismissing with prejudice, its action to pursue all collection efforts against the Petitioner by means of Administrative Wage Garnishment." *Id.* Accordingly, the Secretary's motion is GRANTED. It is

ORDERED that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *with prejudice*. The Stay of Referral to the U.S. Department of the Treasury entered on August 11, 2021, is hereby VACATED.
